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Eligibility





- Ex-offenders
- Carers
- Ex-carers
- Members of a family where a child is at risk of becoming Looked After
- A homeless person or at risk of becoming homeless
- A former member of Her Majesty's (HM) Armed Forces (AF)
- A member of the HM AF reserves
- A working age adult with disabilities known to Adult Services
- A partner of current or former Armed Forces personnel
- A person for whom a drug or alcohol dependency
- A care leaver
- A refugee
- A victim of domestic violence;
- A young person in a gang
- Working age adult with a mental health condition known to secondary care services
- Have a disability/health conditions as defined by the Equality Act 2010*

People with a disability/health conditions as defined by the Equality Act 2010

"A physical or mental impairment that has a 'substantial' and 'long-term' negative effect on your ability to do normal daily activities."

This could be:


- A physical or mental impairment
- A substantial or long-term illness that effects their ability to do normal day-to-day activities
- Are certified as blind, severely sight impaired, sight impaired or partially sighted
- Have a degenerative disease such as multiple sclerosis
- Are HIV positive even if you don't have any symptoms
- Have a severe disfigurement for example severe facial scarring or a skin disease
- Have cancer, including growths that need removing before they become cancerous
- Neurodiverse conditions such as Dyslexia, Austism Spectrum Disorder, ADHD, Tourettes

The JETS Programme

Eligibility Explained

To be eligible for WHP: JETS the individual needs to

- Be of working age (18 years old to State Pension age)
- Have the right to reside and enter employment in England.
- Be in receipt of Universal Credit and in the "Intensive Work Search Regime" group or New Style Jobseekers Allowance.
- Have been unemployed and in receipt of one of the above benefits for at least 13 weeks.
- Be motivated to find work and require light touch employment support.
